ONLINE COURSES

Our courses, launched in September 2012, include the development of language skills and the acquisition of all the knowledge required by the official examinations of the University of Cambridge (KET, PET, FCE, CAE, BULATS).

The course methodology is not only focused on developing the capabilities and understanding of our students, but also on incorporating, in parallel, the learning of grammar and vocabulary in a practical and natural way. In this way, the course also includes listening activities, so the student can exercise and develop this skill as well as expanding vocabulary depending on the corresponding topic of each unit.

All courses are designed respecting the CEF and include:

- Writing
- Listening
- Speaking
- Grammar
- Vocabulary

The courses of the Cambridge Institute Online platform are developed on the Moodle e-learning platform. Courses are available 24 hours a day and 7 days a week, so that everyone can access the platform and study when find it more convenient.

All our online courses material has been developed by our Contents Department. That is to say, it is exclusive and original content created considering current issues of interest, so that students not only can develop language skills, but also acquire useful and updated information about the English speaking countries.

The Cambridge Institute Online Courses Division meets all the requirements set by the Common European Framework and are available on our platform from A1 to C1 level. Each level is approximately 180 workload hours (divided into 3 modules of approximately 60 hours each), according to the requirements described in the Common European Framework. Each level covers the needs and contents for those students who want to take the appropriate official examination offered by Cambridge University ESOL Examinations.

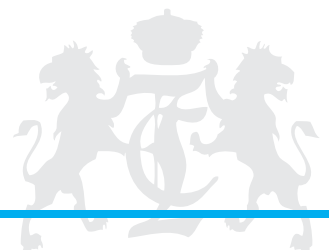
